Council Approves Utility Projects and Recognizes Sgt. Paul Kimberlin

At the December 8 meeting, the City Council approved a resolution awarding the contract for the Unity Park Storm Drain Rehabilitation Project. As part of the 2017 bond election voters approved funding for drainage improvements to Unity Park. The contract, in the amount of \$274,222.50, was awarded to DBi Services, LLC, to replace the existing 78-inch corrugated metal pipe and replace it with a new 78-inch reinforced concrete pipe. Work on the project will begin early 2021.

Council also approved the contract for water line replacement for Glenmere Drive, Camden Drive, Turpin Drive, La Mesa Drive, Spruce Drive and La Mesa Drive wastewater line. The contract was awarded to ANA Site Construction, LLC in the amount of \$799,221.00, which was budgeted through the Utility Fund. This project will ensure a more reliable and dependable water and water system and will comply with TCEQ requirements.

During the Mayor and Council reports, Mayor Wilcox recognized Sgt. Paul Kimberlin with a proclamation honoring his 22 years of service with the City of Highland Village Police Department. During his tenure Sgt. Kimberlin served on the Policy Review Committee, as an Auxiliary Liaison, AOR District Supervisor, Vehicle and Traffic Coordinator, Field Training Officer, and Defensive Tactics Instructor. Kimberlin received over 56 commendations and multiple awards for Supervisor of the Year. Sgt. Kimberlin's last day of duty was on November 29, 2020.

Mayor Wilcox and the Highland Village City Council will be participating in the Red Kettle Challenge benefitting the Salvation Army. Lewisville Mayor, Rudy Durham, issued the challenge to Mayor Wilcox to see who can raise the most money for the Salvation Army.
